



ability to turn math into a source of amusement and camaraderie highlights the diverse ways in which individuals contribute to the unique tapestry of the clubhouse community.





JoJo's Story

At the age of two, I would get these splitting, debilitating headaches. So much so that my parents took me to the University of Michigan Hospital in Ann Arbor. At first, the neurologists were confused as to what to diagnose me with as there was no clear cause for the symptoms I was having. At the age of seven, I was given a plethora of tests: CAT scans, Xrays, and MRIs. They discovered deposits of calcium in my brain. Still, they had no precedent for which to diagnose me, as they had never seen anything like this before. This was

also when I was prescribed Ritalin. This was terrible for me as it really started to affect my mood. I would get these angry, violent thoughts, that I never acted on, but had them, nonetheless. It wouldn't be until I turned twenty, and had control over my own healthcare decisions, of which I took full control and fired every doctor and neurologist I had up until this point. It took two weeks for my new neurologist to diagnose me with Fahr's Syndrome, a rare brain disease that had coalesced into mental illness. The mental illness was what they were trying to fix, but the calcium was the cause. In 2016, I joined Clubhouse Inspirations, a mental health social club that intends to bring those with a diagnosis into the community in many aspects. At the Clubhouse I learned how to become my own advocate, and really began to turn my life around. I became my own guardian, and even won the "My Life" award. Given to those who take control of their lives despite the forces operating against them.





Clubhouse Inspiration is a community of people working together for a common goal, offering people living with mental illness hope and opportunities to reach their full potential. We operate on proven standards which have been developed by Clubhouse International over two decades which are effective in over 320 clubhouses worldwide. The basic components of successful clubhouses are the work-ordered day, employment programs, evening, weekend, and holiday activities, community support, outreach, education programs, and self-governance.
